


On behalf of all Stoney Creek Council members and all the school staff, we would like to wish you a Happy Lunar New Year and a prosperous year of the Tiger.

Our school will receive 20% commission of all sales and those proceeds will go towards supporting classroom learning.







Programs at Creekside



The Burnaby School District invites applications for the following casual, on-call positions: STUDENT SUPERVISORS &/OR CROSSING GUARDS

Student Supervisors provide support for students during the lunch break, ensuring student safety in and around our schools and work during the school lunch break period for 70 minutes. Crossing Guards provide support for students arriving/departing from school, and can work one hour before school, and one hour after school. Applicants for these positions will have a Grade 12 education, and demonstrated ability and experience in working with children. Applicants must be available to work throughout the District when school is in session.

Wildlife around Stoney Creek!



Cougars or wolves can be seen in urban areas. The City of Burnaby is home for many species of wildlife including bears, deer, coyotes, beavers and squirrels. Viewing wildlife within an urban area can be a wonderful experience, but sometimes a nuisance or a safety concern. The province is responsible for wildlife management and conservation concerns, and provides information to residents to reduce human-animal conflict.


If you see wildlife involved in any of the following, please report to a BC Conservation Officer at the 24 hour, Toll Free Call Centre - 1-877-952-7277:

- ♦ Accessing garbage or other human supplied food sources
- ♦ Wildlife that cannot be easily scared off
- ◆ Dangerous wildlife is in a public location like a city park or school during daylight hours
- ♦ The following information may be useful for some human-wildlife interactions in Burnaby. If you observe dangerous wildlife in an urban area







Parent Information Night February 9th, 2022 6-8 pm Online via Zoom

What we say and how we talk about substance use matters...



Build your knowledge and confidence in speaking with your child about drug and alcohol use...

In this session we will focus on:

- Current substance use trends. Societal and media influences around substance use. What you should know about substance use and the law.
- How to talk with your child about substances they may be exposed to as they get older.
- How to respond to a child who is exposed to peer substance use, experimenting with use or is struggling with substance use. Helping youth understand signs of an overdose and how to respond.
- Increasing your confidence, competence and comfort level in discussing drugs and alcohol with your child.
- The importance of decreasing stigma when talking about substance use and addiction.
