We encourage you to pay online via <u>School Cash</u> which is a safer and more secure way.



Students are reminded that they **ARE NOT** to be using scooters on school property. This is absolutely prohibited as it is a safety concern. Although students are welcome to use their scooters to travel to and from school (provided they are wearing a helmet), once they arrive at school, they are to get off and walk the scooter. A good way to remember is scooters are permitted along the front sidewalk of the school and that is it!! Once you start down the walkways of the school grounds, students must exit the scooter and carry it while on school grounds. Scooters are forbidden to be operated in the staff parking lot as well, for obvious safety reasons. If this continues to be a problem, students may be

asked to leave their scooters at home.

As the weather will be turning nicer after Spring Break, I would like to remind all our families that the above rules also apply to bikes. There are couple bike racks located on school grounds and students are encouraged to bring a lock to secure their bike while they are at school during the day. Like scooters, helmets are required for riding bikes as well.

Dogs on school grounds continue to be a problem despite it being mentioned many times in newsletters. Once again, we are requesting that dogs are NOT brought onto the school grounds during drop off and pick up times. If you choose to bring your dog during these times, please wait from your child (ren) on the sidewalk in front of the school and DO NOT bring your dogs onto the school grounds. We appreciate your cooperation in this matter.

In response to some of the comments we were hearing from both parents and teachers, we are happy to be hosting a Lunch and Learn for parents/guardians to help with some of the issues around friendships and anxiety. This will be hosted by Suzanne Vardy and Jen Ingham, members of the Safe and Caring Schools Team for the Burnaby School District.

Here is a bit of what Suzanne and Jen have planned: As children develop, they begin to navigate friendships with increasing independence. In this presentation, we will talk about peer relationships and the conflicts that can occur as children enter this stage. We will look at how parents can guide children and to nurture the problem solving and social skills as they are developing. There will also be a bit of a focus on anxiety and supporting children who are worried.

## Salmon in the Classroom

All 55 chum salmon are currently at the alevin stage of the life cycle. Division 6 and 7 have been recording the daily Accumulated Thermal Units (ATUs), while using the data to make estimates of when the alevin will become swim-up fry.

Our most recent estimate shows the alevin will develop into fry around April 15th, and we will release them two weeks after they become fry. Division 6 and 7 have been learning about the anatomy of salmon, through a dissection of seven adult salmon. We had a great time learning about the different body parts of salmon and their use.
