Anyone with children who will be starting Kindergarten in September, needs to register anytime this month for the 2023 - 2024 school year. We continue to struggle with the number of students who are arriving late in the morning. We are hoping parents can help with getting morning routines going a bit more quickly so that our students are arriving ON TIME for the first bell at 8:50 am. This helps everyone – <u>teachers</u> do not have to report students as absent/late; the <u>office</u> does not have to change the code in the Attendance system AND make a phone call home; <u>parents</u> do not have to have their day interrupted to take a call from the school asking about their child. It just saves everyone precious and valuable time in the morning, which we all know is important. <u>A few reminders ...</u>

What NOT to bring to school:

Toys, electronic devices, trading cards or anything of value should be left at home to avoid loss or damage. Cell phones are not permitted during school hours. Students who have a phone are required to keep them turned off and put away during the day. Should you need to contact your child during the school day, we ask that you call our main office at 604-296-9031. Any bikes or scooters brought to school need to be locked up in the under-cover area beside the parking lot. Students are to walk bikes and scooters when on school grounds.

With regard to Cell phones – there has been a dramatic increase in student cell phone usage lately and it has become very problematic which is the reason for this reminder. We completely understand that parents give their children phones for safety reasons. The problem we are having is that phones are coming out during class and recess and lunch times and this is not acceptable. When students arrive on school grounds phones need to be put away – no exceptions! Students who continue to have st

grounds phones need to be put away – no exceptions! Students who continue to have struggles following this rule will have their phone taken away from them through the following progressive steps:

- R The first time the staff will ask the child to put the phone away
- The second time the staff member will take the phone away and give it to the child's teacher for safe keeping until the end of the day
- The third time the phone will be given to the Principal/Head Teacher and a parent will have to come pick it up and have a discussion with the Principal/Head Teacher and have a discussion about the guidelines around cell phone usage

The biggest reason we do not want cell phones out during class time is for the distractions they pose in addition to the fact that we are not responsible for them should they get damaged/go missing. Cell phones are best kept in backpacks. If a child wishes to ask a teacher to secure their phone for the day, they can have that conversation with the teacher. It is up to the individual teacher whether or not they are willing to do that.



Dogs on School Grounds

As per the sign, which is clearly posted in several locations on our school grounds, just a reminder that ALL DOGS on school grounds need to be ON LEASH.

There have been some issues where this has not been the case and we just want to remind everyone about this, as well as to please pick up after your pet. Students can end up quite 'messy' when this does not happen. Thank you. We appreciate your cooperation with this.

YMCA Access

A reminder to any parents who access the YMCA for before and after school care: the staff parking lot is for staff ONLY. Parents who are using the Y for before and after school care should NOT be parking in the staff parking lot to drop off/pick up their child at the Y. I see this happening on a regular basis, especially when I am arriving early in the morning. It is also happening at the end of the day as well. We have extremely limited parking. In fact, on some days, some staff members have to park on the street. It is also a safety risk to have children walking through the parking lot when staff are coming and going to and from work. We are fortunate in that there is ample street parking for



parents when accessing the Y. We are all concerned for the safety of our students and we need your cooperation to ensure that everyone makes it to and from the Y and school, safely.


Pink Shirt Day • Feb. 22, 2023




